Adult Volunteer Literacy Tutoring programs provide one-on-one tutoring for adults who want to improve their reading, math, writing and language skills. Family Literacy programs equip parents with the skills needed to help themselves and their children get a good start on their education. The Penny Severns Family Literacy Program promotes continued learning for families throughout the summer months. And the educational needs of working adults are met through Workplace Skills Enhancement programs, which provide on-site learning opportunities at their workplaces.

Literacy Need in Illinois

The most recent census information collected by the American Community Survey indicates a great need for adult literacy and English language instruction among the 11.8 million Illinois residents.

The survey indicates that 2.5 million (21.3%) residents over age 5 speak a language other than English in their homes. Of those who speak a language other than English, 1.1 million (44.7%) report that they speak English less than very well. These numbers are only some of the possible Illinois residents who could benefit from English language instruction. Many factors in the survey keep it from capturing all those who would benefit from English language instruction. For example, immigrants from other countries who lived under oppressive governments may hesitate to respond to the census, and some people may also overestimate their own language proficiency.

More information from the survey shows that of the 8.3 million Illinois residents over age 25, about 525,000 (6.3%) have less than a 9th grade education. In addition, another 662,000 (8.0%) residents have between a 9th and 12th grade education with no high school diploma. That means 1.2 million (14.2%) of the population over age 25 do not have a high school diploma. These numbers are undoubtedly higher than shown since the survey did not take into account those residents between ages 18 and 24 who have less than a 9th grade education or who have no high school diploma. Also, there are people who graduate from high school and yet lack adequate literacy skills.

Therefore, conservatively, these figures show that roughly 2.3 million, or 19 percent, of Illinois residents could benefit from adult literacy or English language instruction. (Source: American Community Survey, 2005-2009, <http://factfinder.census.gov>)

Secretary of State/ — Illinois State Library Literacy Grants —

The Illinois State Library Literacy Office administers two literacy grant programs.

1) The **Adult Literacy Grant Program** encompasses the following areas:

- **Adult Volunteer Literacy Tutoring Project** — Provides training for volunteers who tutor adults over age 16 in basic reading, math, writing or language skills. Participating educational agency partners may include libraries, volunteer tutoring organizations, community based organizations, community colleges, regional offices of education, schools (individual and public), pre-school programs, school districts, domestic violence shelters and correctional facilities.
- **Family Literacy Project** — Provides instructional services to parents and children to enhance their basic reading, math, writing or language skills together and separately. Participation by the entire family increases the benefits of the instruction. Projects must partner with an adult literacy provider, a child-at-risk organization and a library.
- **Workplace Skills Enhancement Project** — Provides on-site instructional services to employees of Illinois businesses to enable them to increase their basic reading, math, writing or language skills, maintain their employment and increase their eligibility for promotion. Eligible employees read at or below the 9th-grade level. Grantees must match the grant award and may also provide instructional services to prospective employees. The fiscal agent and submitting agency may be either the educational partner or the business partner.

2) The **Penny Severns Family Literacy Grant Program** provides instructional services that enhance the basic reading, math, writing or language skills of both parents and children during the summer when many traditional educational programs close. Services include educational experiences that build on community resources for family learning. Individual grants are awarded to public libraries.

Fiscal Year 2011 final reports submitted by 82 programs funded through the Illinois State Library Literacy Office revealed the following statistics:

Student Statistics

- 20,837 students served.
- Average student age is 37.
- 59 percent are female and 41 percent are male.
- 38 percent of the adult learners are employed.
- 55 percent of the students study English as a Second Language.

Volunteer Statistics

- 8,193 volunteers.
- 74 percent of the volunteers are female.
- The average age is 46.
- On average, volunteers spend 14 hours in pre-service training and three hours of in-service training.
- According to the Independent Sector, volunteer service equates to \$22.34 per hour in Illinois. Volunteers provided \$8,338,517 of service to the Illinois effort. For more information, visit www.independentsector.org/volunteer_time.

Inmate Programs

- 25 volunteer literacy tutoring grantees are coordinating tutoring services in 29 correctional facilities.
- 1,904 students were being served in a correctional setting.

FY11 Vignette

Jane Addams Hull House Association, Chicago

A 48-year-old female supervisor at a Chicago hospital needed to read and speak better. She had a high school diploma but scored below the 8th grade level on her pre-test. She had very low self-esteem and self-worth due to a 15-year marriage where she was verbally abused. She enrolled in the program at Jane Addams Hull House Association but didn't want any of her staff or co-workers to know what she was doing. She began working with a tutor on her lunch hour in the same neighborhood she worked. Her tutor not only worked with her on reading but encouraged and motivated her to improve her self-esteem. She worked with her tutor speaking and reading out loud and gradually she gained confidence. She now will look you in the eye when speaking and she speaks with confidence. In just a year, she has come far. She knows she has self-worth and is not ashamed to let people know what she has done and who helped her get there.

Spotlight on Achievement and Spotlight on Service Awards

The fiscal year 2011 awards, sponsored by Secretary of State and State Librarian Jesse White and the Illinois Press Association's Foundation, recognized 11 individuals nominated from current adult learners statewide who have shown tremendous growth as they work to improve their reading skills or to learn the English language. Each adult learner received a plaque, a personalized *Illinois Blue Book*, a check for \$200 and a bag of books.

Ten literacy volunteer tutors also were honored for their generous efforts and dedication in helping adult learners reach their reading goals. Each volunteer received a plaque, a personalized *Illinois Blue Book*, and \$200 was donated to the literacy program for which they volunteer.

Family Literacy Project

Fiscal Year 2011 final reports submitted by 49 programs funded through the Illinois State Library Literacy Office revealed the following statistics:

Student (Adult) Statistics

- 1,437 adults served.
- 93 percent of the adults are female.
- 70 percent of the adults study English as a Second Language.
- Average age of the adult student is 32.
- 69 percent obtained a library card.

Student (Child) Statistics

- 1,960 children served.
- 50 percent of the students are female.
- Average age is 4.5.
- Average adult/child activity time together is about 22 hours; average child alone activity hours are 152.

FY11 Vignette

Albany Park Community, Chicago

A family from Mexico with two children ages 3 and 5 participated in the Family Literacy program for more than 3 years and maintained nearly perfect attendance. The mother frequently stayed after class to ask questions about the topics covered in Parent Education. She always attended special events and field trips. When the oldest daughter was nearing kindergarten-age, she worked with the Parent Education staff at Albany Park Community Center to apply to magnet and selective enrollment schools. After being tested, her daughter was accepted and now attends a high-performing gifted school in the district. The Parent Education staff also assisted the mother in using the online registration system to enroll in classes at the Chicago Park District, and her children have taken piano, art and swimming classes.

When the family experienced an emergency, the mother's English-speaking skills and knowledge of our culture helped her handle the situation. Her son stopped breathing suddenly as they were driving down the street, and she remained calm enough to approach a police car and ask for help. Fortunately, her son recovered fully after the police called an ambulance. She was interviewed about the incident on the local television news and spoke English with poise.

The mother improved her English speaking so much that her test scores indicate she's ready to move on to the local community college. Her next goal is to work toward a GED with the long-term goal of becoming an Early Childhood Teacher.

— Workplace Skills Enhancement Project —

Fiscal Year 2011 final reports submitted by 31 businesses funded through the Illinois State Library Literacy Office revealed the following statistics:

Typical Employee/Student Statistics

- 864 employees assessed and/or instructed.
- About 48 percent of the students are female.
- Average age of employees was 41.8.
- 78 percent of the employees study English as a Second Language.

Why employees want to participate in Basic Skills Training

- They will be less reliant on translators and more confident in communicating with supervisors and co-workers.
- They will use math skills learned in the classes on the floor daily.
- They will be eligible for promotions that become available.

Why employers want to participate in Basic Skills Training

- Employees are better able to communicate with immediate supervisors and to participate and contribute in work team activities.
- Supervisors notice that participants have a better understanding of manufacturing practices and are able to use that to check shop orders.
- Promotion of individuals who have participated in the classes result in improved morale, heightened expectations, and greater interest in additional training.

FY11 Vignette

Labriola Baking Company, Alsip

Educational Provider: South Suburban College, South Holland

Route sales drivers participated in the training program at the company this year. Besides delivering products, drivers serve as customer service representatives for the company, dealing with problems and answering questions. They also serve as secondary sales representatives focusing on new products or suggesting alternatives. The company purchased a new handheld, computerized device for the drivers to use with menus only in English. The drivers were encouraged to improve their English skills to be able to talk better with customers and use the new equipment. Many of them had been using the same type of invoices and paperwork for so long they needed to improve their English in order to learn the new system.

Improving their English helped keep them motivated and keep their jobs. No one had to be replaced because they could understand the new technology and their bosses better after attending the 10-week class. The drivers regularly attended classes after an 8-10 hour work day, which impressed the company. They received positive comments from their teacher, and their bosses are more confident in their abilities.

Penny Severns

Family Literacy Program

A special \$250,000 appropriation by the General Assembly in honor of the late state Sen. Penny Severns of Decatur was granted to the Illinois State Library. Summer 2011 final reports revealed that 37 projects served 1,959 adults and 3,818 children.

FY11 Vignette

William Leonard Public Library District, Robbins

An extensive curriculum was developed for the program, including field trips and projects that applied to the participants' everyday lives. Adult participants were required to read every day and complete a book review each week. Adults also participated in computer classes and parent workshops. With the help of an expert gardener, adults and children built and planted a raised garden, which produced healthy, organically grown vegetables all summer. One family that participated in the summer program had a child who was not doing well in school. The parents were concerned that the child was reading far below grade level. The child enjoyed the summer program so much that her reading progressed to at or above her grade level. The family continues to enjoy activities at the library and participate in the after school program as well.

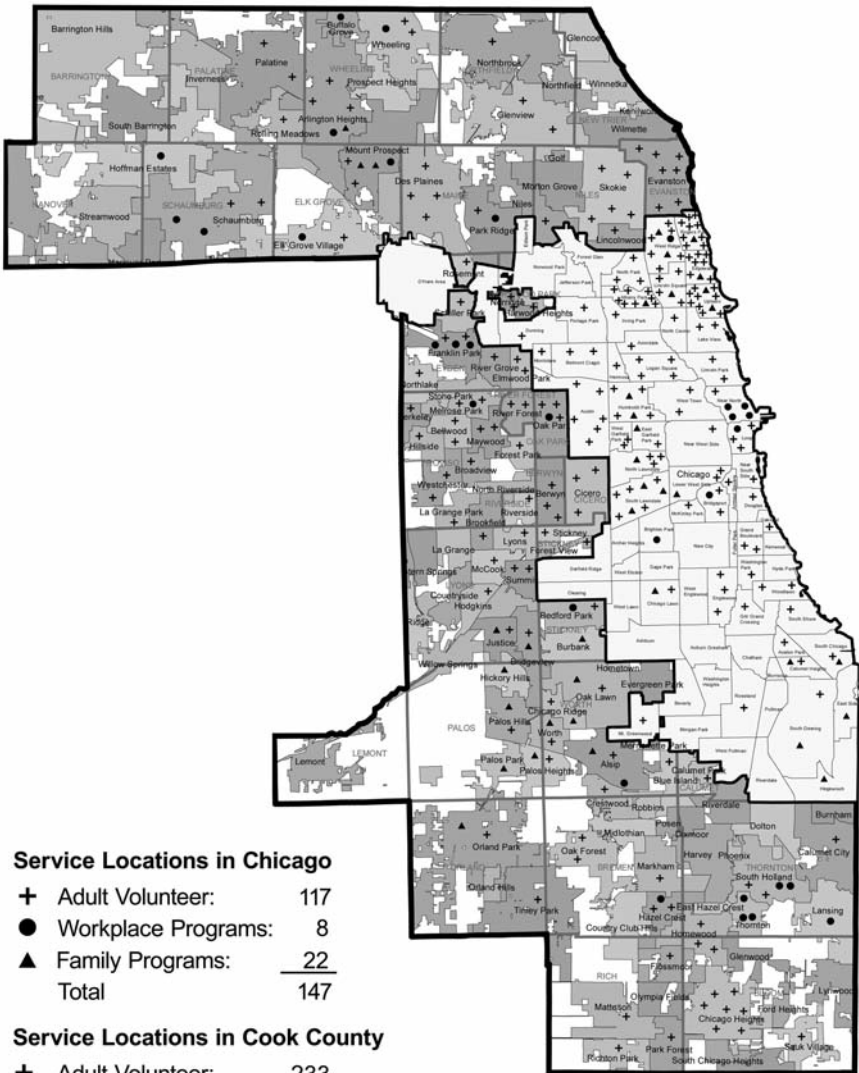

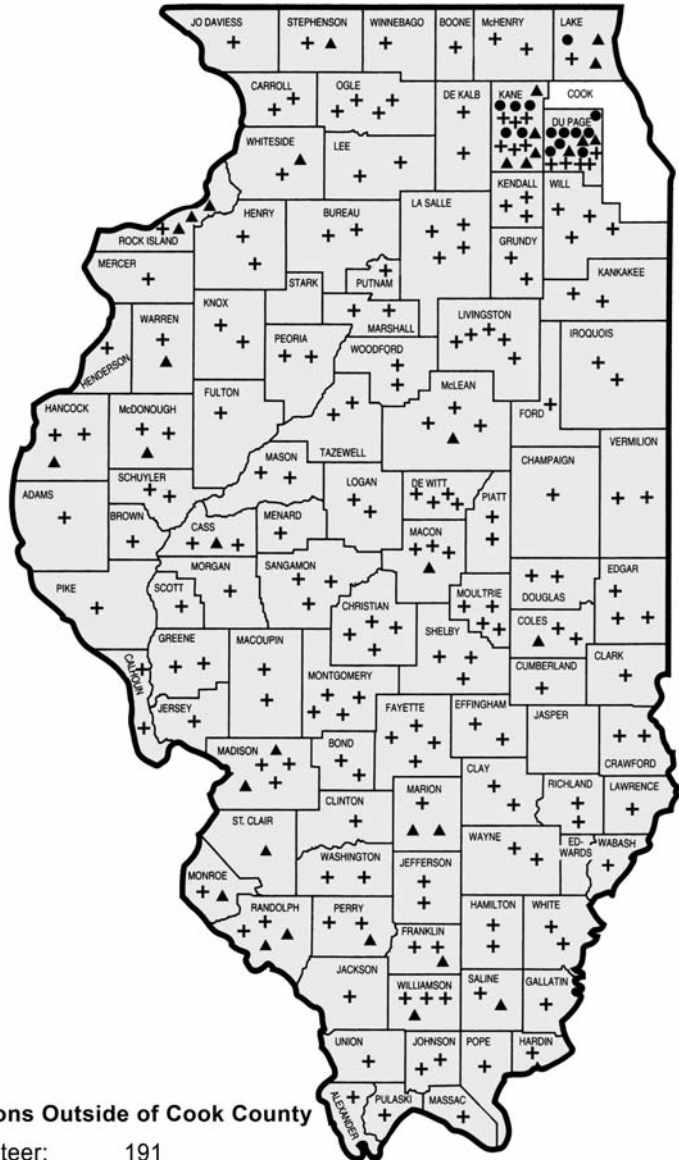
